Batch of Maldives Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) Executives and Officials going to India for a one-week training Programme



A batch of 29 Maldives Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC)'s Executives and Senior Officials are travelling to India to participate in a 1-week long, from 17-22 July 2023, "Capacity Building Programme for Executives and Senior Officials of ACC". The training is being conducted by National Centre for Good Governance (NCGG) New Delhi in coordination with various Anti-Corruption, Ethics and Integrity related institutions of India.

The capacity building programme is being conducted as per the requirements indicated by ACC Maldives. During the one-week stay at NCGG, participants will have sessions, lectures, case studies by various experts from Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), Central Vigilance Commission (CVC), etc on topics like handling of financial frauds, economic crimes, cyber crimes & cyber security, bribery cases, learning modern forensic investigation techniques, mechanisms for international cooperation to fight corruption, etc besides exposure visits to Intelligence Fusion and Strategic Operation cell (IFSO), National Cyber Forensic Laboratory (NCFL), Interpol Wing of CBI. As part of the training, they will also get a opportunity to visit beautiful & one of the wonders of the world, Taj Mahal.

The partnership between India and Maldives is truly multifaceted. Collaboration in the area of training and capacity building is a key pillar of this partnership & is further growing. Since 2019, despite COVID19 challenges, **more than 2300** Maldivians has traveled to India to participate in various capacity building training in areas ranging from Civil Services & Good Governance, Security, Customs, Media, Judiciary, Audit & finance, Health, Agriculture, Decentralization, Environment, Youth and Sports, etc under various bilateral MoUs, ITEC, ICCR fellowship, etc. Besides that, **more than 1600 virtual** training slots have been utilised in various areas.
