Frenetic diplomatic training activities and outreach defined the last quarter of the Sushma Swaraj Institute of Foreign Service (SSIFS)' calendar. Both the verticals were intensely involved in rolling out courses under their respective charges. SSIFS was the proud host of the 48th Annual Meeting of the International Forum on Diplomatic Training (IFDT) in November 2022. IFDT is the premier global forum that brings together more than 70 diplomatic training institutes and academic institutions from around the world. The 48th Annual Meeting of IFDT, which coincided with Government of India's 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' celebrations, was attended by more than 60 Heads of Diplomatic Training Academies, Deans of academic institutions and other delegates drawn from over 40 countries.

In December 2022, SSIFS welcomed the latest entrants to the Indian Foreign Service fraternity - the IFS Officer Trainees of the 2022 Batch along with two Foreign Service Officers from Bhutan. During the Orientation Module, held from 12-22 December 2022, they called on the External Affairs Minister, all three Ministers of State for External Affairs and Foreign Secretary. Training programmes were also conducted in November 2022 for the Haryana Institute of Public Administration (HIPA) on India and its neighbourhood and in December 2022, Protocol Training for G20 Liaison Officers from other Gol Ministries was organized.

Under the Foreign Training vertical, we were delighted to roll out the 69" edition of SSIFS" month-long flagship programme, the Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats (PCFD) which resumed after the COVID hiatus in October 2022. Forty-six young diplomats from forty-six countries participated in the programme. Fulfilling a commitment undertaken in the First India-Central Asia Summit in January 2022, the 2rd Special Course for Diplomats from Central Asia was conducted in December 2022. The 62rd and 63rd editions of the Know India Programme (KIP) were held in quick succession in November and December 2022 respectively where SSIFS hosted half-day orientation sessions on India and the broad contours of its foreign policy. The KIP is organized by MEA's Overseas Indian Affairs-II Division for young Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs).

It was a hectic quarter for MEA Staff training where Promotion-related training (for ASOs, PAs and Stenographers) and posting-related programmes were conducted sequentially.

The first quarter of 2023 is already geared up to be a hectic one with all our training programmes running at full steam. We look forward to sharing news on those fronts in our coming editions. # Training Programmes for other Civil Service Officers

### **Training Programmes for Foreign Diplomats**

### 69th Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats

The 69<sup>th</sup> edition of SSIFS' flagship programme, the Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats (PCFD), resumed after the COVID hiatus and was successfully conducted from 03-28 October 2022. Forty-six young diplomats from forty-six countries participated in the programme.

PCFD, which started in 1992, is the flagship programme for training of foreign diplomats. Held twice a year, in spring and autumn, it affirms India's commitment to its partner countries in sharing the knowledge and expertise acquired in the field of diplomats' training.

The 69<sup>th</sup> PCFD was inaugurated on 03 October 2022 by Dean (SSIFS), Amb. Sanjiv Ranjan, who delivered

the Inaugural Address. MOS for External Affairs & Education, Dr. Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, was the Chief Guest at the Valedictory Ceremony held on 28 October 2022.

The programme included sessions on various topics including India's foreign policy, key international issues, multilateral diplomacy and diplomatic skills. There were also sessions on Ayurveda and Yoga. The participants got an exposure to modern India's economic and technological developments. They also undertook study tours both within and outside Delhi to experience the rich cultural heritage of India. The participants made interesting country presentations at the end of their training stint with SSIFS.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Special Course for Diplomats from Central Asia

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Special Course for Diplomats from Central Asia took place from 05-16 December 2022. This course was offered by India at the First India-Central Asia Summit held virtually in January 2022. Twentynine diplomats from the Central Asian Republics of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan attended the course. The Special Course was inaugurated on 05 December 2022 by Dean (SSIFS), Amb. Sanjiv Ranjan. The Valedictory Ceremony, held on 28 October 2022, was graced by Secretary (West), Amb. Sanjay Verma.

The training programme included modules on India's foreign policy, India's relations with Central

Asia, multilateral diplomacy & WTO, UN reforms, space diplomacy, India's perspectives on nuclear non-proliferation & disarmament, negotiation skills, water security, Gol's economic initiatives and economic reforms, digital empowerment, India's pandemic response, women in diplomacy, INSTC etc. There were also sessions on Ayurveda and Yoga. As a part of their study tours in New Delhi, the diplomats undertook visits to Rashtrapati Bhavan, Election Commission of India, National Museum and the Gurgaon automobile plant of Maruti Suzuki India Ltd. They undertook a day-long visit to Agra to see the Taj Mahal. The participants made interesting country presentations.

### **Know India Programme (KIP)**

Orientation Sessions for the 62<sup>nd</sup> and 63rd Know India Programmes (KIP) were organized by SSIFS in collaboration with MEA's OIA-II (Overseas Indian Affairs-II) Division on 04 November 2022 attended by 40 young Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) from fourteen countries and on 23 December 2022 attended by 38 PIOs from twelve countries respectively. ### **Training Programmes for MEA Officials**

- ❖ A Promotion-related Training Programme for 70 Assistant Section Officers and Cypher Assistant Section Officers (25 officials attended physically at headquarters and 45 joined in virtually from Missions and Posts abroad) was conducted in hybrid mode from 21-25 November 2022.
- ❖ A Promotion-related Training Programme for 54 Personal Assistants and Stenographers (21 officials attended physically at headquarters and 33 joined in virtually from Missions and Posts abroad) was conducted in hybrid mode from 28 November − 02 December 2022.
- ❖ An IVFRT (Immigration, Visa and Foreigners Registration and Tracking) Training was conducted for 38 MEA officials from 06-08 December 2022. This is a posting-related training programme.

### 48th Annual Meeting of the International Forum on Diplomatic Training [IFDT]

SSIFS organized the 48th Annual Meeting of the International Forum on Diplomatic Training (IFDT) from 14-18 November 2022. IFDT is a premier global forum that brings together more than 70 diplomatic training institutes and academic institutions from around the world. The 48th Annual Meeting of IFDT, which coincided with Government of India's 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' celebrations, was attended by more than 60 Heads of Diplomatic Training Academies, Deans of academic institutions and other delegates drawn from over 40 countries.

The Annual Meeting was inaugurated on 15 November 2022 by Secretary (Economic Relations), Shri Dammu Ravi, who delivered the Keynote Address on the occasion. Shri V. Muraleedharan, MoS for External Affairs & Parliamentary Affairs and Smt. Meenakashi Lekhi, MoS for External Affairs & Culture, addressed the delegates on 15 November and 16 November 2022 respectively.

On 15 and 16 November 2022, eight panel discussions on a range of topics related to diplomatic training and issues of global importance were held under the overarching theme of 'Diplomacy for Development'. Panellists and moderators included representatives of IFDT member institutions, United Nations officials, senior officials of Government of India, eminent domain experts including former Ambassadors of India, and members of academia and think-tanks. On 17-18 November 2022, visits to iconic monuments in Delhi and Agra were organized for the IFDT delegates. Site visits to the India International Trade Fair (IITF), and the National Crafts Museum were also conducted.
